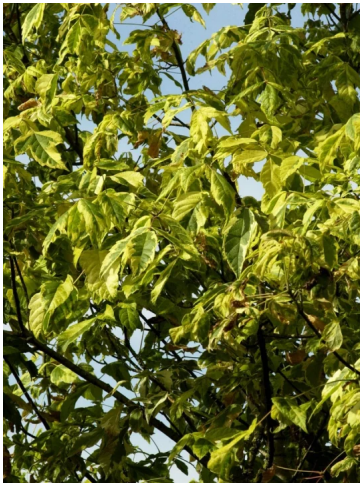
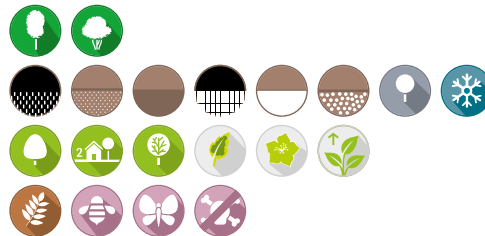




## Acer negundo 'Aureomarginatum'

| <b>Height</b>                | 6 - 10 m, fast growing                                                |
| <b>Width</b>                 | 5-8m                                                                  |
| <b>Crown</b>                 | wide, egg-shaped, half-open crown                                     |
| <b>Bark and branches</b>     | young twigs shiny green and pruinose                                  |
| <b>Leaf</b>                  | unevenly feathered, yellow-white margins, up to 20 cm, feathered leaf |
| <b>Flowers</b>               | female, pendent in thick clusters, April                              |
| <b>Fruits</b>                | falcate, winged, in racemes                                           |
| <b>Spines/thorns</b>         | None                                                                  |
| <b>Toxicity</b>              | usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock               |
| <b>Soil type</b>             | few requirements, also in calcareous soil                             |
| <b>Paving</b>                | tolerates no paving                                                   |
| <b>Winter hardiness zone</b> | 5a (-28,8 to -26,1 °C)                                                |
| <b>Wind resistance</b>       | moderate to poor                                                      |
| <b>Other resistances</b>     | resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)                                         |
| <b>Fauna tree</b>            | resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), valuable for butterflies               |
| <b>Application</b>           | industrial areas                                                      |
| <b>Shape</b>                 | clearstem tree, multi-stem treem                                      |
| <b>Origin</b>                | Dieck Baumschulen, Germany, 1885                                      |

Small to medium-sized tree (sometimes large shrub) with a wide, upright growth habit, reaching a height of circa 6 - 10 m. The differences with the other cultivars of *A. negundo* are few, but for the colour of the leaves. 'Aureomarginatum' has dark green leaves with creamy-yellow to cream coloured margins. Regularly completely creamy-yellow leaves appear on the tree too. During the summer months this “variegated” effect becomes less conspicuous. The tree grows both on wet and dry sites. It has a deep rooting main root which branches out strongly. This is an old female cultivar, dating from 1885. 'Aureomarginatum' can perfectly be applied in parks and large gardens.
