



Acer platanoides 'Drummondii'



Height	8 - 10 m, slow growing
Width	7-9m
Crown	broad pyramidal, dark, dense crown
Bark and branches	twigs light brown, bark smooth, dark grey
Leaf	5-lobed, dark green with creamy yellow to creamy white margin, about 18 cm
Flowers	yellow-green, in corymbs, April, before the leaf development
Fruits	winged nutlets (samara), 3.5 - 4.5 cm long
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	has toxic components
Soil type	any
Soil moisture	withstand short flood
Paving	tolerates partial paving
Winter hardiness zone	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
Wind resistance	good: cannot tolerate sea wind
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, valuable for butterflies
Application	avenues and broad streets, industrial areas
Shape	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem
Origin	Messrs. Drummond, Stirling, Scotland, before 1910

A tree with a wide pyramidal crown. A rather slow grower, that, with a height of 8 to 10 m, stays smaller than the species. The green leaves have strikingly cream-white margins. The occasional branches with wholly green leaves should be removed promptly. Flowers and fruit are typical of the species. 'Drummondii' needs a sunny site and is suitable for use as a park tree. Requires a good top soil to grow and, moreover, is tolerant to peat. Good wind tolerance.
