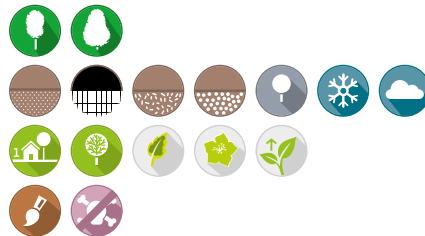




## Fagus sylvatica 'Viridivariegata'

Fagus sylvatica 'Viridivariegata' attains a height of circa 15 - 20 cm and has a spreading ovoid to round crown. The only difference with the species being the colour of the leaf. 'Viridivariegata' has a dark-green leaf with strikingly light-green speckles, especially along the lateral veins. The glossy leaf reaches 4 - 10 cm in size and has an undulating margin. The autumn colour is yellow brown. The soft bark is smooth and grey. Blooms with small, inconspicuous flower catkins. Small nutlets appear in autumn. Park tree and solitary. It prefers not too wet, well-drained soil, high in humus content. Less tolerant to hard surfacing. Moderate wind resistance. Winter hardiness zone: 6a
