



Hamamelis xintermedia 'Jelena'



Height	4-5 m
Width	4-5m
Crown	broad vase-shaped, half-open crown, capricious growing
Bark and branches	brown
Leaf	green
Autumn colour	yellow, orange, red
Flowers	brass orange, flowers in December
Fruits	brown
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, acid soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	6b (-20,5 to -17,8 °C)

Sturdy shrub to small tree about 4 m high and broad, with a broad, vase-shaped growth pattern. Does not branch strongly when young. The somewhat glossy, dark green leaf turns yellow, orange, and red in autumn. Blossoms fairly early in winter, around December/January. The flowers measure about 4 cm and are coppery orange. They have hardly any fragrance. This cultivar was initially distributed on a small scale under the provisional name 'Copper Beauty': this name was never published and remains only as a synonym. The unique flower colour makes 'Jelena' an indispensable cultivar in the assortment.
