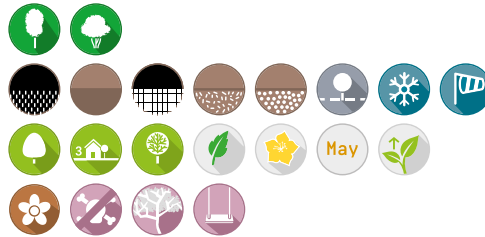




Magnolia ×brooklynensis 'Yellow Bird'



Height	5-10 m
Width	3-5m
Crown	broad ovoid, dark, dense crown, capricious growing
Bark and branches	brown, grey
Leaf	green
Flowers	bright yellow, flowers in April
Fruits	inconspicuous
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, acid soil
Paving	tolerates partial paving
Winter hardiness zone	6 (-23,3 to -17,8 °C)
Wind resistance	good
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
Application	avenues and broad streets, small gardens
Shape	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

Medium-size tree with a regular pyramidal to broad ovoid crown of 5 - 10 m. The first flowers open around mid-May and the blossoms persist for about 3 weeks. The flowers are 7.5 - 10 cm in size and bright yellow. They stand out well against the light green leaves. The petals are fairly broad, giving them a tulip-like appearance. Originated in 1967 in the Brooklyn Botanic Garden, New York, USA, by backcrossing *M. x brooklynensis* 'Evamaria' with *M. acuminata*, but was not named until 1981. Good, tree-size, yellow blossoming Magnolia.
