



## Platanus ×hispanica 'Tremonia'



<b>Height</b>	15 - 20 m
<b>Width</b>	5-10m
<b>Crown</b>	pyramidal, half-open crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	bark grey-green, scaling yellow-green
<b>Leaf</b>	palmately lobed with 3 - 5 lobes, green
<b>Flowers</b>	spherical heads, yellow-green, May
<b>Fruits</b>	spherical, spiky, brown, usually in pairs
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	all, soil not too limy
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	6a (-23,3 to -20,6 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	moderate to good
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), resistant to de-icing salt
<b>Application</b>	avenues and broad streets, narrow streets
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree
<b>Origin</b>	Botanischer Garten Rombergpark, Dortmund, Germany, 1951
<b>Synonyms</b>	Platanus × acerifolia 'Tremonia'

A German selection with a pyramidal crown and a vertical main trunk. Height 15 - 20 m. It is characterised by the flaking bark with a light green to yellow-green underground, and grey-green, dark green or brown pieces that flake off. The broad palmate lobed leaf has 3 - 5 sharply serrated lobes and is slightly hairy on the underside. In the autumn the leaves turn colour to a brownish yellow. Fallen leaves do not rot easily and remain on the ground around the tree. Plane trees are very resistant to hard surfaces but surface roots can push the surrounding paving upwards. Takes pruning very well, even in old wood. Saplings are sensitive to frost and need a tree stake for support. Winter hardiness zone: 6a
