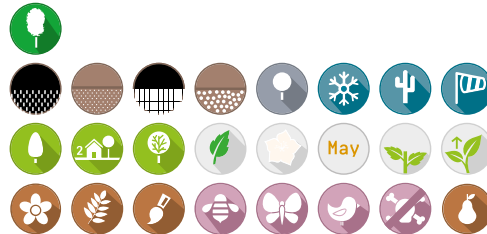




Sorbus aucuparia 'Rossica Major'



Height	8-10 m
Width	6-8m
Crown	ovoid / egg-shaped, half-open crown
Bark and branches	grey
Leaf	green, feathered leaf
Autumn colour	orange, red
Flowers	white, flowers in May
Fruits	orange, red
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	loamy soil, sandy soil, acid soil, calcareous soil
Soil moisture	suitable for dry soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
Wind resistance	good
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, provides food for birds
Application	avenues and broad streets, narrow streets, tree containers, roof gardens
Shape	clearstem tree

Sorbus aucuparia 'Rossica Major' is a vigorous tree with branches that grow vertically and an ovoid crown. Height 8 - 10 m. The leaves are a remarkable deep green and the leaf stem is red and bears soft hairs. The separate leaves can be 8 cm long and have variable autumnal colours. Large umbels of relatively large, often more than 1.5 cm in diameter, deep red fruits appear in August and September. Winter hardiness zone: 4
