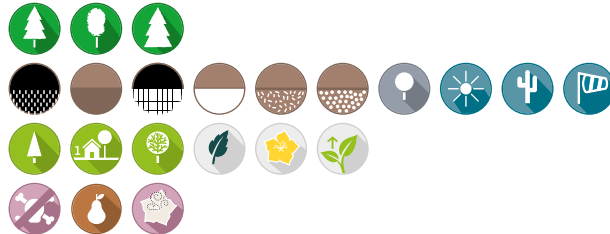




Cedrus libani 'Glauc Fastigiata'



Height	20 - 25 (40) m
Width	8-10m
Crown	narrow conical, dark, dense crown
Bark and branches	black-grey bark, scaly, twigs downy hairy
Leaf	needles intense green-blue, 2 – 2.5 cm
Flowers	inconspicuous: ♂ greenish yellow, in cylindrical upright cones, 5.0 cm, ♀ oval, green to purple
Fruits	barrel-shaped cones, 5 - 7 cm long, changing from green to brown
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	all, provided well-permeable and not too moist
Soil moisture	suitable for dry soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	7a (-17,7 to -15,0 °C)
Wind resistance	good
Other resistances	can withstand wind
Application	industrial areas
Shape	clearstem tree, clearstem conifer, specimen conifer

Cedrus libani 'Glauc Fastigiata' is very similar to the cultivar 'Fastigiata', but has more intense green-blue needles. Furthermore, 'Glauc Fastigiata' also has a dense branching of upward-pointing branches and twigs. This creates the typical narrow pyramidal crown shape. Because of this crown shape, the tree is more suitable in places where there is slightly less space. Its intense foliage colour combines well with other plantings.

According to nomenclature rules, cultivar names may not be given in Latin after 1 January 1959. Since 'Glauc Fastigiata' was named in 1972, this cultivar name is therefore not actually legal. But in the absence of a modified name, not in Latin, the tree is therefore known as 'Glauc Fastigiata' for the time being.
