



Acer campestre 'Eko Effen'



Height	6-8 m
Width	3-4m
Crown	ovoid / egg-shaped, dark, dense crown
Bark and branches	brown, grey
Leaf	green
Autumn colour	yellow
Flowers	yellowgreen, flowers in May
Fruits	redgreen, inconspicuous
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, all soil types
Paving	tolerates partial paving
Winter hardiness zone	5a (-28,8 to -26,1 °C)
Wind resistance	good/very good
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, resistant to de-icing salt

Application	avenues and broad streets, narrow streets, tree containers, roof gardens, coastal areas, industrial areas
Shape	clearstem tree

Small tree with a dense, narrow, ovoid crown, somewhat narrower than 'Elsrijk'. Grows a straight central leader to produce a regularly formed crown. The dark green leaf is undulate and turns yellow to brownish yellow in autumn. It is a very healthy tree with good resistance to mildew, red spider mite and gall mite. The rather slender growth pattern makes 'Eko Effen' suitable for use in narrow streets, housing estates and green borders. However, the tree can also be used to create high hedges. Does not grow well enclosed by paved surfaces. Winter hardiness zone:
