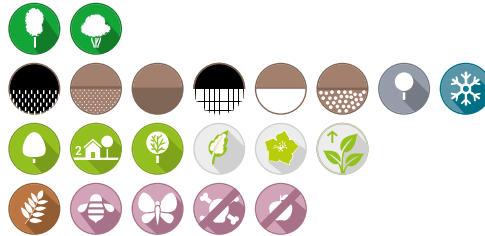




Acer negundo 'Flamingo'



Height	5 - 7 m, fast growing
Width	5-7m
Crown	egg-shaped, later wide egg-shaped, half-open crown
Bark and branches	young twigs shiny green and pruinose
Leaf	unevenly feathered, silver-white with a pink margin, up to 20 cm, feathered leaf
Flowers	in thick bundles, before the leaves appear, April
Fruits	none, fruitless cultivar
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	few requirements, also in calcareous soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	5a (-28,8 to -26,1 °C)
Wind resistance	moderate
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), valuable for butterflies
Application	industrial areas, small gardens, patio gardens
Shape	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

A fast growing, medium-sized tree, reaching a maximum height of 7 m. This cultivar differs little from the other cultivars of the A. negundo with variegated leaves. The leaves are green with silver-white to light-pink margins. Young unfurling leaves have a nice light-pink colour. 'Flamingo' can be applied in parks and gardens. The tree grows both on wet and dry sites. It has a deep rooting main root which branches out strongly. Regular pruning will stimulate the growth of finely coloured young sprouts.
