New American selection outstanding for its hardiness. Oval, dense, closed crown. Its branches have a crotch angle of 45 degrees. Height circa 12 m. Young twigs are strikingly red brown. The leaf stalk too, is red. The leaf itself is dark green and can be circa 10 cm. The orange-red autumn colouring can differ from year to year. A male variety without any flowers or fruits. Limy soil stunts the growth. No colouring in dry soils. Poor tolerance to (sea) wind. Winter hardiness zone: 4
